This event will highlight the importance and quality of Scotland's heritage science output and will demonstrate the close and productive working between heritage institutions and specialist university research groups.

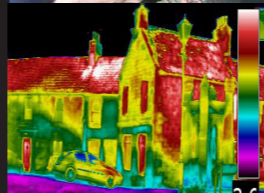
The speakers will be a mixture of scientists and non-scientists working in the heritage field, and the event will have four themes:
