



Hazard Information for teachers

Argyll's Lodging, Stirling

Argyll's Lodging is situated below Stirling Castle in Stirling on the A9. The site consists of a splendid example of a 17th century noble townhouse with gardens and walls surrounding the property.

It is the responsibility of teachers and group leaders to complete a risk assessment prior to any site visit with a group. This is a requirement of most education authorities. The following information is intended as a preparatory tool and does not replace a teacher's or group leader's own risk assessment.

Please be aware that changes in weather may affect the risks inherent in an outdoor site. Pupils should dress for outdoors.

Potential hazards at Argyll's Lodging

Pedestrian access to site

- No coach parking on site. Coaches should be parked in the coach park at the Castle. Risk from other cars when walking to and from Argyll's Lodging.

External Hazards

- Boundary walls around monument should not be climbed.
- Grass in garden may become slippery when wet.

Internal Hazards

- Two staircases, one narrow and winding.
- Low doorways throughout.
- Low lighting throughout.
