



Hazard Information for teachers

Broughty Castle Museum

Broughty Castle is situated in Broughty Ferry off the A930. The site consists of a 15th-century castle, now adapted to house a museum.

It is the responsibility of teachers and group leaders to complete a risk assessment prior to any site visit with a group. This is a requirement of most education authorities. The following information is intended as a preparatory tool and does not replace a teacher's or group leader's own risk assessment.

Please be aware that changes in weather may affect the risks inherent in an outdoor site. Pupils should dress for outdoors.

Potential hazards at Broughty Castle Museum

Pedestrian access to site

- Risk from moving traffic in car park.

External Hazards

- Castle is on the shores of the Tay. Please supervise pupils closely.
- Uneven steps and surfaces underfoot – trip risk.
- High drops behind some walls – please do not allow pupils to climb walls.
- Cobbled surfaces and grassy banks may become slippery in wet weather.

Internal Hazards

- Steep and winding spiral staircase.
- Some low doorways.
