



## Hazard Information for teachers

# Glenluce Abbey

Glenluce Abbey is situated in two miles north-west of Glenluce village off the A75. The site consists of a ruined 12th century abbey set within peaceful grounds.

It is the responsibility of teachers and group leaders to complete a risk assessment prior to any site visit with a group. This is a requirement of most education authorities. The following information is intended as a preparatory tool and does not replace a teacher's or group leader's own risk assessment.

Please be aware that changes in weather may affect the risks inherent in an outdoor site. Pupils should dress for outdoors.

### Potential hazards at Glenluce Abbey

#### Pedestrian access to site

- Risk from other moving traffic in car park.

#### External Hazards

- Shallow ditch in car park and uneven surfaces underfoot – trip risk.
- Do not climb on walls – fall risk.
- Metal barriers surround ditch in abbey.

#### Internal Hazards

- Grass and stone slabs may become slippery in wet weather.
- Three stone steps down to chapter house.
- Natural lighting only in abbey.
- One low doorway clearly marked.
