



Hazard Information for teachers

Inchmahome Priory

Inchmahome Priory is situated on an island in the Lake of Menteith, reached by ferry from Port of Menteith eight miles south of Callendar off the A81. The site consists a ruined monastery dating from 1238.

It is the responsibility of teachers and group leaders to complete a risk assessment prior to any site visit with a group. This is a requirement of most education authorities. The following information is intended as a preparatory tool and does not replace a teacher's or group leader's own risk assessment.

Please be aware that changes in weather may affect the risks inherent in an outdoor site. Pupils should dress for outdoors.

Potential hazards at Inchmahome Priory

Pedestrian access to site

- Risk from other moving traffic in the car park.
- Please supervise pupils closely on the ferry to the island. Lifejackets available and a safety talk is given by the boatperson before leaving the mainland.

External Hazards

- Some paths can become muddy in wet weather.
- Uneven surfaces underfoot – trip risk.
- Interpretation signs around the island are at ground level – trip risk.

Internal Hazards

- Some low foundations and uneven surfaces – trip risk.
- Only natural lighting within the priory.
