



Hazard Information for teachers

Kildrummy Castle

Kildrummy Castle is situated 10 miles south-west of Alford on the A97. The site consists of a ruined 13th-century castle with curtain wall, four round towers, hall and chapel.

It is the responsibility of teachers and group leaders to complete a risk assessment prior to any site visit with a group. This is a requirement of most education authorities. The following information is intended as a preparatory tool and does not replace a teacher's or group leader's own risk assessment.

Please be aware that changes in weather may affect the risks inherent in an outdoor site. Pupils should dress for outdoors.

Potential hazards at Kildrummy Castle

Pedestrian access to site
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Take care from other moving traffic in the large car park.
External Hazards
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • High walls with high drops – do not climb on the walls. • Cobbled surfaces underfoot – trip risk. • Surfaces underfoot may become slippery in wet weather. • Steep grassy bank surrounding castle.
Internal Hazards
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Low lighting levels.
