Through this programme we help conserve the heritage at risk through urgent repairs to places of worship, so they have a sustainable future. The UK-wide scheme is delivered through four programmes in England, Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales. Repair Grants for Places of Worship in Scotland are offered up to £250,000.

Through the RPOW programme we aim to achieve the following outcomes:

- conserving historic places of worship through urgent repairs;
- ensuring regular maintenance of places of worship;
- increasing opening hours (or maintaining them at the minimum level required) and opportunities for people to learn about places of worship.
